01:37am Illegal Drugs – Wade Green Road

An officer stopped a minivan with a Kentucky tag for an equipment violation. There were four people inside the van and an officer saw a nearly empty bottle of vodka on the rear floorboard. The four gave some conflicting statements about the purpose of the trip which led to the officer searching the van. He found two bundles of cash in the glove compartment. Inside a bag belonging to one of the passengers, a 31 Kentucky woman, was a bag with some prescription medication prescribed to her. However, one of the bottles had several different types of pills inside. There was also a cigar tin with a small amount of marijuana. She was arrested and charged with open container of alcohol, possession of a controlled substance and misdemeanor possession of marijuana. There were several business cards for pain clinics in Florida and prescription receipts for the woman and another one of the passengers. The officer told them that he thought they were “doctor shopping” and the man said “you could call it that”. No one else was charged but the cash, almost \$4,000 was seized.

03:34am Burglary – 3338 Cherokee Street, Shell Food Mart

An officer responded to an alarm and found the front door to be propped open on the deadbolt and metal shaving on the ground. The owner arrived and could best determine that only some cigarette cartons had been taken. Video surveillance showed two males dressed in all black enter the store after one of them forces the door open with a pry bar. They go behind the counter at which time a third man comes in with a garbage bag. They are in the store just a few seconds before leaving.

not be in the park alone unless she was 12. The girl then ran home. She said the man looked to be around 20 years old.
